The internship selection committee works to ensure we only recommend good pairings. For this reason, it is possible you will not be paired if the committee doesn't feel we have a suited student. If this is the case, we ask and encourage you to apply again in subsequent seasons. We also arrange a virtual meeting between you and the selected intern. This provides both of you an opportunity to opt-out, if necessary, before the internship.
