The **Fourteenth** Mid-Atlantic Junior Angus Classic (MAJAC) will be held March 9-11, 2012 at the Rockingham County Fairgrounds. Please note all of the specific information for this show (the MAJAC Regional Preview) in this section. You will also need to review the "general rules" section as they apply to all shows listed in this packet.

The Schedule of Events has changed-PLEASE make note and read it carefully! "Angus: Break the Ice" has been added to Friday afternoon. Showmanship will be a "traditional" showmanship. Be sure to mark your entry form if you plan to participate. **Check-in will ONLY be on Friday evening-ending at 7 pm.**

The Futurity 2012 Heifer jackpot and the On-Stage 2011 Steer jackpot will be held at the MAJAC again! Please be sure to mark the appropriate places on your entry form for these "special" classes!

Please note that the applications for registration and transfer of ownership must be recorded in the sole name of the exhibitor and postmarked by **February 1, 2012. No late transfers or registrations will be accepted.** In addition, all entries must be postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service on or before **February 1, 2012. No late entries will be accepted.** Entry fees of \$20 per head made out to the American Angus Association must accompany entry forms.

# MID-ATLANTIC JUNIOR ANGUS CLASSIC REGIONAL PREVIEW SHOW RULES

## Show Categories:

1. There will be classes for cow-calf pairs, bred-and-owned bulls, bred-and-owned heifers, bred-and-owned steers, owned heifers, owned steers and crossbred steers as well as the On-Stage steer jackpot class and the Virginia Futurity heifer jackpot class. Champions will be selected in each category. There will be no overall champion.
2. The crossbred steer division is for black-hided, black-haired, Angus-influenced crossbred steers. The calf must be predominately black. (The Show Committee will have the final decision.) All steers will be weighed and classes broken according to those weights. All steers will be judged as "feeder" cattle; there will not be any market classes.
3. Entries will be listed in the catalog in order of age (youngest to oldest), and will be led into the show ring in order of catalog number.
4. Classes will be made up after cattle have been checked-in at the show with no more than 15 head in any class. Most classes should have no more than a 30-day spread in age, and many may have only a few days spread. Classes will not be named, and may not follow standard classifications in age breakdown.
5. Any cow-calf pair may be exhibited provided the calf is bred-and-owned by the junior exhibitor and the following rules are met:
  - A. Cow must be bred-and-owned or solely owned by the exhibitor. If the cow was not bred by the exhibitor, the issue date on the recorded transfer of the cow must precede the breeding date of the cow for the calf at side.
  - B. Calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and **must be born on or after June 5, 2011.**
  - C. Calf must be registered and tattooed by show date and have original registration paper.There will be no separate division for bred-and-owned vs. owned cow-calf pairs.
6. Show classifications for heifers: September 1, 2010 through December 31, 2011.
7. The Futurity Heifer Class is a "jackpot" class for registered Angus heifers which were purchased from the Futurity Heifer Sale which was held on Sunday, October 16, 2011 OR if they were nominated from a Virginia production / consignment sale. Each consignor contributes \$25 to the "pot" and the funds are divided up amongst those heifers which are exhibited in the Futurity Heifer Class at MAJAC.
8. Show classifications for bulls: January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011.
9. Show classifications for steers: January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011.
10. The On-Stage Steer Class is a "jackpot" class for registered Angus steers which were purchased from the On-Stage Sale which was held on Sunday, October 16, 2011. Each consignor contributes \$25 to the "pot" and the funds are divided up amongst those steers which are exhibited in the On-Stage Steer Class at MAJAC.
11. **Showmanship will be a traditional format with the following age divisions: Senior, Intermediate, Junior, Novice (novice is defined as an exhibitor who is in their first year of eligibility in the National Junior Angus Association – meaning the NJAA member was 9 years old on January 1, 2012) and PeeWee (those youngsters not old enough to exhibit at the junior Angus shows). The cattle will be shown clean – not fit. Please be sure to sign up on the entry form.**

## Awards:

1. Awards are being coordinated by the Northern Virginia Junior Angus Association. There will be prizes for Champions of each major division. There will not be any premium monies paid.
2. Premier Breeder includes the three highest placing animals bred by a single breeder. Champions will be used only in the case of a tie. The winner, to be determined at the conclusion of the show, receives a silver tray. The American Angus Association sponsors this award.

## MAJAC Code of Conduct

In order to assure safe and productive educational programs and activities, the following is adopted as the Mid-Atlantic Junior Angus Classic's Code of Conduct. Each junior member is to take a full and active interest in all parts of the planned program. The applicable code will be enforced in a firm, fair, and equitable manner. ALL ADULTS SHOULD ABIDE BY THE INTENT OF THIS CODE.

This code of conduct serves as a notice of behavior expectations for all program participants. The following types of behavior will not be tolerated:

- Deliberate destruction of facilities or equipment.
- Possession or use of fireworks or firearms.
- Possession or use of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs.
- Possession or use of any tobacco products by youth under 16 years of age.
- Any sexual or pornographic activities.
- Theft of any property.
- Abusive language.

Any behavior not specifically covered above but deemed a serious breach of conduct will be reviewed by the show managers.
