- 1. Western States Perpetuating Memorial Scholarship** - one \$250 award is given  
Eligibility: Junior member of the American Angus Association who has exhibited in the Western Regional Junior Angus Show and resides in a participating member state (ID, OR, WA, UT, MT, AK, CA, AZ, NV). Applicant must be a graduating senior. The application consists of writing a 250 word essay. - 2. Western States Angus Auxiliary Scholarship** - two awarded at \$500 each

Please note that the applications for registration and transfer of ownership must be recorded in the sole name of the exhibitor and postmarked by March 1, 2014. Bred-and-owned animals must be registered by the entry deadline of March 1, 2014. If you don't have registration papers on newly purchased animals in your hands two weeks prior to the ownership/transfer deadline for a particular show, please contact the American Angus Association. NO LATE TRANSFERS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE DEADLINE.

Entries must be postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service no later than March 1, 2014. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED! The entry fee of \$50 per head must accompany the entry form. This entry fee includes the bedding in the barns.

Check with your local veterinarian for rules concerning entering the state of Nevada and returning to your home state. If you have any questions about this you may call the Nevada State Veterinarian's office at (775) 688-1180. Please note the trucking and brand inspection papers information also enclosed. **Special Note:** The state of Nevada **may require** a test for Trichinosis. A complete set of health rules will be sent in the confirmation letter.

Once again, the Western Regional will be held in conjunction with the Western National Angus Futurity. # Western Regional Junior Angus Show – Show Rules

## I. SHOW CATEGORIES

1. There will be classes for bred-and-owned bulls, bred-and-owned heifers and heifers owned but not bred by exhibitor, steers and cow-calf pairs. Champions will be selected in each category. There will be no overall champion.
2. Entries will be listed in the catalog in order of age (youngest to oldest) and will be led into the showing in order of catalog number.
3. Classes will be made up after cattle have been checked-in at the show with no more than 15 head in any class. Most classes should have no more than a 30-day spread in age and many may have only a few days spread. Classes will not be named, and may not follow standard classifications in age breakdown.
4. Division champions will be named in the owned heifer category (i.e., summer calf, late spring calf, early spring calf, senior calf, intermediate champion and junior champion). Division champions will be named in the bred-and-owned heifer category (i.e. late and early calf, intermediate and junior yearlings). If more than 50 head of bred-and-owned bulls are shown, division champions in the respective categories will also be named.
5. Show classifications for heifers: January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2013.
6. Show classifications for bulls: January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2013.
7. Show classifications for steers: January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.
8. Any cow-calf pair may be exhibited provided the calf is bred-and-owned by the junior exhibitor and the following rules are met:
  - A. Cow must be born on or before December 31, 2011.
  - B. Cow must be bred-and-owned or solely owned by the exhibitor. If the cow was not bred by the exhibitor, the **issue date** on the recorded transfer of the cow must precede the breeding date of the cow for the calf at side.
  - C. Calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and **must be born on or after July 12, 2013.**
  - D. Calf must be registered and tattooed by show date and have original registration paper.

There will be no separate division for bred-and-owned vs. owned cow-calf pairs.

## II. PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

1. Any questions regarding premiums or awards should be forwarded to the Association office no later than six weeks after date of show.
2. Each entry shown shall receive a ribbon and premiums. Banners and trophies will be awarded to champions in each division and category.
3. Premiums will be paid according to the following schedules:

Owned Heifers and Steers:  
1st-\$50; 2nd-\$45; 3rd-\$40; 4th-\$35; 5th-\$30; 6th-\$25; 7th-\$20; 8th through 15th-\$15.

Bred-and-Owned Heifers and Bulls and Cow-Calf Pairs:  
1st-\$85; 2nd-\$75; 3rd-\$65; 4th-\$55; 5th-\$45; 6th-\$35; 7th-\$25; 8th through 15th-\$15.
4. Entries meeting the following requirements by entry deadline will receive an added 25% to their premiums:
  - A. Entry must have weights processed through the Angus Herd Improvement Records (AHIR) program.
  - B. The dam of the entry must have weight information processed on her previous calves, or if the entry is her first calf, the dam's own performance records must have been processed through AHIR.

## 5. Other Awards

### Best Five Head:

1st-\$75; 2nd-\$50; 3rd-\$25; others-\$15.

Five individual animals, entered by three or more exhibitors from a junior Angus association, which was organized prior to January 1, 2013, are eligible. Limit: one group per association. Only junior association members may enter the show ring. Limit: five holders plus one or two "stickmen." No entry fee. Banners will be awarded for each animal in the top group.

Premier Breeder includes the three highest placing animals bred by a single breeder. Champions will be used only in the case of a tie. The winner, to be determined at the conclusion of the show, receives a silver tray.

Junior Premier Breeder includes the three highest placing animals bred by a junior breeder. Champions will be used

## III. MISCELLANEOUS

1. Tie outs will be available. Facilities will be available Tuesday, April 15. Stalls are given by the number of head an exhibitor entered. If additional space is needed for tack, the exhibitor will be charged \$50 for each 4 feet wide/stall space.  
**Entries MUST be checked into the show by 12 p.m. on Thursday, April 17.**
2. Entries will be released upon completion of the show on Friday, April 18. Any entries that leave prior to that time will forfeit all premiums and awards.
3. Any cattle that show in the open show are not released until the conclusion of the open show on Saturday, April 19.

## IV. TRUCKING, BRAND INSPECTION PAPERS, REGISTRATION PAPERS:

1. The following trucking regulations are in effect in Nevada: Farm vehicles are exempt from carrier licensing and also the transportation of livestock by the owner thereof on his own single unit truck of 10,000 lbs. or less unladen weight. If the vehicles mentioned above are diesel powered, it will be necessary to purchase a 48-hour temporary fuel license. Units weighing over 10,000 lbs. and any units hauling for hire will need 48-hour temporary licenses and registrations. It will be necessary for drivers to obtain licenses at the first available vendor upon entering the state of Nevada.
2. All animals from states other than Nevada must be accompanied by brand inspection papers! Nevada cattle must have a transportation slip.
3. Bring your **ORIGINAL** registration certificates and be certain that all tattoos are correct and legible. If you have any tattoo problem, contact the American Angus Association (816) 383-5100 **PRIOR** to arriving at the show.
