THE ANGUS Family GIVES BACK

Monday, May 17, 2021, marked a new day in Angus history.
Starting this year, the Angus Foundation hosted its inaugural
Angus Day of Giving, a fundraiser and holiday within the Angus
community to both support and celebrate the breed.

On the same day of the year in 1873, George Grant arrived in Victoria, Kansas, with the first Angus cattle in North America. Since that time, Angus has grown into a high-quality and popular breed in the United States.

The breed has become a symbol of pride, dedication, work ethic and passion for many cattlemen and women across the country. Countless families and friendships have been woven with Angus cattle as the fabric.

This year the Angus Day of Giving raised \$14,000 to support the Angus Fund. In addition, the Angus Day of Giving was able to welcome more than 25 new individuals as Angus Foundation donors. Through the Angus Fund, the Angus Foundation supports programs that equip Angus juniors to lead, fund research, award

academic scholarships to juniors and provide educational resources for breeders and cattlemen such as Angus University and the Beef Leaders Institute.

"The Angus community yet again showed up to support the future of our breed. The posture this industry holds toward philanthropy is truly incredible."

First-Even TECHNICAL SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP

John Mrotek of Fredericksburg, Virginia, founded the John R. Mrotek Family Technical Education Scholarship Endowment Fund in 2020 to **provide academic scholarships for students pursuing education in career and technical programs**. This scholarship is the **first of its kind** for the Angus Foundation, as it specifically targets youth in trade schools and supports vocational careers. For the first time the John R. Mrotek Family Technical Education Scholarship was awarded to Maguire Rohr of Elbert, Colorado.

"It's been really neat to be **the first person ever to get this scholarship**," Rohr said.
"I know there will be more people who receive this scholarship down the road, so it's been really cool to be the first."

Maguire Rohr, a rising sophomore at Hutchinson Community College in Hutchinson, Kansas, is the first student to receive this new scholarship. It was presented to him by the Mrotek family at the 2021 National Junior Angus Show in Grand Island, Nebraska.





Hands-on experience is arguably the most valuable way to learn – just ask the four young people who interned this summer with the Talon Youth Educational Learning Program. The Talon Internship is a learning opportunity for college students from coast to coast to gain new experiences while working and learning with an Angus host. Interns learn about the breed while being molded into advocates for the entire beef and agricultural industry.

The internship honors the legacy of the late Camron "Cam" Cooper of the Talon Ranch, Twin Bridges, Montana. Cooper developed the Angus/Talon Youth Educational Learning Program Endowment Fund in 2009 with her
