


The first National Junior Angus Showmanship Contest was held at Keeneland Racecourse in Lexington, Kentucky in conjunction with the 1967 American Angus Breeder's Futurity. Since 1974, the Contest has been moved to coincide with the National Junior Angus Show, but the idea is still the same - the best showmen in the country compete for the title of "Champion Angus Showman". The contest will be broken into heats and each state representative will compete.



## DETAILS

After all contestants compete in their respective heats, the top 15 showmen will then move on to compete in the finals. This contest is sponsored by the American Angus Auxiliary. To be eligible to compete in the contest, participants must qualify by placing first or second in their respective state junior showmanship contest.

## WHO CAN ENTER

Only the top 2 senior showmen from the state showmanship contest may compete in the National Junior Angus Show, Showmanship contest. Contestants must be 14 years or older as of January 1, see the contest rules for specific birthdates that are eligible.

## HOW TO ENTER
